

## **Camper Information Summer 2006 Camp Omega**

### **Payment of Camp Tuition Balance**

It is now easy to register multiple family members, access your account balances, and automatically pay your balance. Check it out at [www.campomega.org](http://www.campomega.org).

- All balances are **due 7 days prior** to the start of your camp program. If you registered online you can pay this balance through your online account.
- To receive the early registration discount for weeklong Classic Camps, your balance must be paid in full on or before March 1, 2006.

### **Supervision**

All counselors are over 18 years old. Our 10 days of staff training includes safety, health, program, and Bible Study preparation. All counselors are Red Cross certified in CPR and First Aid. All aquatic activities are under the direct supervision of Red Cross certified lifeguards.

### **Camp Store**

The camp store is open two times a day and offers candy and pop. Youth campers may order up to three food items per store visit. Clothing and other items may be purchased during check-in and pick-up times.

### **Camp Bank**

Campers who wish to use the camp store must deposit their money into the camp bank during registration - except for family camp events. The store will not accept cash except during registration and after the close of camp. A tally of all purchases will be kept in the store, and any money not spent will be returned at the end of the camp session.

### **Check-in**

Sunday Camp Check-in: 4:00-5:00 p.m.

Other Camp Sessions: 6:30-7:00 p.m.

Cabin assignments and camp bank deposits will be handled at one table. The nurse on duty will be available for special health concerns, for depositing medication, and health updates. Please mail your health history form and full payment prior to the start of camp, it will speed the check-in process. We invite parents and campers to the Outdoor Worship Center, following camper check-in, for a brief orientation.

### **Camper Pick Up**

Weeklong programs end with a noon devotion on the last day of the camp session. Parents may attend this devotion and pick up their camper between 12:15 - 1:00 p.m. All other programs end at noon with camper pick up between noon and 1:00 p.m.

### **Mail**

When you mail a letter to your camper please include the following on the envelope.

- 1.) Camper's full name
- 2.) Cabin they are staying in
- 3.) Camp session they are attending

### **Camper E-Mail**

We will check the camper e-mail address once a day around 9:00 a.m. Please indicate your camper's name, cabin name, and camp session in the subject of the message. Please do not send attachments or e-greeting cards. If possible, please do not send your camper multiple e-mails each day. Campers will not be able to send e-mail from camp.

Please put your camper's name on their belongings! **Please leave cell phones, radios, other electronics, and snacks at home.** Camp is not responsible for lost or stolen articles.

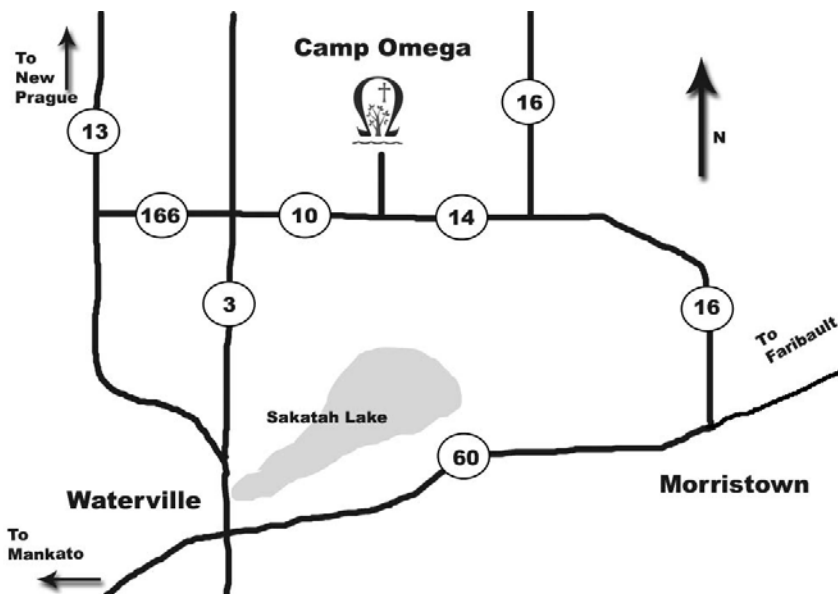
### Health Care

In case of illness or injury, parents or guardians will be contacted. If required, medical services are readily available. All counselors are certified in CPR and First Aid. It is MANDATORY that ALL medication (over the counter and prescription) be correctly labeled and given to the nurse or his/her assistant during registration. Camp guests are responsible for primary medical insurance. A camp policy is available to assist in providing benefits for certain charges that may not be covered by your personal insurance.

### Directions to Camp

**From I35** (from the cities take I35 South) Take Hwy 60 exit at Faribault. Turn left on Highway 60 (west). In Morristown turn right at County Road 16. At the junction of 16 and 14 go straight on 14 for 2 miles. Turn right on Lind Ave and follow to Camp Omega.

**From Mankato/Waterville** From Highway 60 (east) take left on Highway 13 in Waterville. After crossing the bridge at Upper Sakatah Lake, take the second right (County Road 3) and follow for 2.5 miles. Turn on the first paved road to the right (County Road 10). Follow three miles to Lind Ave. Turn left at the camp sign and follow to Camp Omega.



**From New Prague/Highway 13** Follow 13 south. Watch for the blue Camp Omega sign. Turn left on County Road 166 (gravel road) and follow for one mile. Go straight at the stop sign onto County Road 10 and follow for three miles to Lind Ave. Turn left on Lind Ave. and follow to Camp Omega.
