Project 12-Baskets

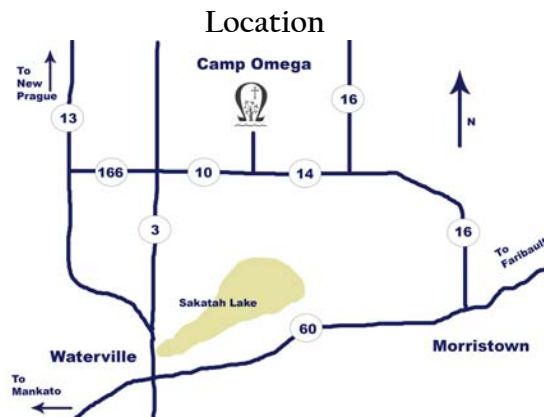
Project 12 Baskets has teamed with Camp Omega to create a marketplace where people can give generously, but do so without giving money.

From I35 (from the cities take I35 South) Take Hwy 60 exit at Faribault. Turn left on Highway 60 (west). In Morristown turn right at County Road 16. At the junction of 16 and 14 go straight on 14 for 2 miles. Turn right on Lind Ave and follow to Camp Omega.

From Mankato/Waterville From Highway 60 (east) take left on Highway 13 in Waterville. After crossing the bridge at Upper Sakatah Lake, take the second right (County Road 3) and follow for 2.5 miles. Turn on the first paved road to the right (County Road 10). Follow three miles to Lind Ave. Turn left at the camp sign and follow to Camp Omega.

From New Prague/Highway 13 Follow 13 south. Watch for the blue Camp Omega sign. Turn left on County Road 166 (gravel road) and follow for one mile. Go straight at the stop sign onto County Road 10 and follow for three miles to Lind Ave. Turn left on Lind Ave. and follow to Camp Omega.

Canteen

Everyday, campers have the opportunity to purchase items such as candy, pop, crackers, and juice at the canteen. Campers will visit the canteen once in the afternoon and once in the evening; they will be limited to three items per visit. Food items cost between \$.75 & \$1.50. Money for the canteen will be banked at registration and purchases will be tallied throughout the week. At the end of the week, remaining balance will be return in the form of cash. Clothing merchandise may be purchased after registration and closing.

Registration

Registration times are as follows:

- 4:00 pm - 5:00 pm for all camps starting on a Sunday
- 6:30 pm - 7:15 pm for all camps starting on a day other than Sunday.
- Camp for People with Developmental Disabilities will begin at 4:00pm and supper will be provided at Camp.

We require that all **balances** are paid and **forms** be received **one week prior** to the campers first day of camp. All campers must have a completed Health History Form on file while at camp (available online) prior to participating. Registration consists of the following:

- Learn your cabin assignment
- Bank your canteen money
- Order a camp picture for \$12 (optional)
- Complete the camper pick up form
- Hand medication and instructions to the Health Care Volunteer on duty
- Meet your camper's counselor
- Purchase clothing merchandise at the canteen.

Medications

Campers are required to turn in all medication to the camp's Health Care Volunteer. Daily instructions and original labeled containers are required for all medications. The Health Care Volunteer will oversee the administration of all medications.

Closing & Departing

Campers and parents are encouraged to participate in the closing celebration will occur at noon of every session. All campers must be signed out with the counselor prior to departing.
