WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

Youth Servant Leader

Bring the Following:

- Bible Tennis
- Shoes
- Sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Towel
- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothbrush, etc.)
- Sun screen
- Enough clothing for your stay (bring clothes for both warm and cooler weather)
- Swimming suit (appropriate for Bible camp please!)
- Rain gear
- Bug spray
- Flashlight

Optional:

- Water shoes (a.k.a. - aqua socks – the bottom of the swimming pool can be somewhat abrasive on toes after a couple days in the pool)
- Guitar or other acoustic instruments suitable for campfire (however, do remember that the campers are your focus and not the guitar)
- Money for canteen and/or camp picture
- Fan (main camp only)

Do Not Bring:

- Alcohol, tobacco, or illicit drugs
- CD's, CD players, stereos, video games, and any other unnecessary electronics
- Inappropriate reading material
- Electric guitars
- Weapons (pocketknives, grenades, etc)

Other Notes:

- Cellular-phones – The campers are not allowed to have cell-phones, therefore it is not appropriate for Volunteers to have cell-phones when around campers. All cell-phones will need to be handed in to the program supervisor at the beginning of the week. They will be made available each day upon request during volunteer time-off.
- Medications – All meds should be handed in to the program supervisor at the beginning of your session and will be made available as specified.
- Car keys – Volunteers who drive will need to hand in their keys and will be given them back at the end of the session.
- Appropriate dress – Please bring only clothing that is appropriate for a Christian camp. When choosing what clothes to bring, err on the side of modesty. We will ask Volunteers to change into more appropriate clothing at our discretion.

The Bottom Line:

When packing for your volunteer session, please remember that the campers look up to you and often model themselves after you. All clothing and other paraphernalia that you bring to camp needs to be appropriate, not hindering or deterring anyone involved with Camp Omega from having a Christ-centered experience at camp.
